

## Tips for Constructing your Pumpkin Racer

## There are only a few simple rules to follow:

- 1. You must fill out a <u>Race Entry Form</u> to enter the race online or at the Ministry HUB.
- 2. Pumpkin racers must be fully assembled and ready to race at check-in (5:00 pm on race day). They will be on display prior to racing for judging of design.
- 3. Pumpkin racers must be less than 20 lbs. (including wheels, axles and decorations) and the wheel base <u>no wider than 16"</u> to fit into a lane for racing.
- 4. Pumpkins can be solid or hollowed out. A heavier racer is not necessarily the fastest.
- 5. Racers <u>must have axels through the pumpkin</u>, and must be propelled <u>only by gravity</u>. (Fans, motors, explosives, pyrotechnics, etc. are not allowed.)
- 6. Make sure the axles are parallel so it will roll straight. Many racers are eliminated because they veer off-course before they cross the finish line.
- 7. Make sure all of your wheels spin freely. We recommend using at least 2.5" wheels. If your wheels are too small, your racer won't get too far.
- 8. Wheels and axles can be purchased at your local hardware store or recycled from castaways found in your garage or a local thrift store, again, axels must go through the pumpkin. No platforms with wheels will be allowed.
- 9. Categories for competition: Fastest, Longest Run and Most Creative Design.
- 10. Have fun making your racer! Pick a theme and be creative. Often the crowd favorites are the most creative entries.
